FOODRESCUE.CA BACKGROUND

- Goal: Divert good surplus food from businesses to not-for-profits
- Expansion through Government of Ontario,
 Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks
- Support from the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care
- Provincial expansion began July 1, 2018
- Work with partner organizations to help them access surplus food within their community



Funded by the Government of Ontario

BENEFITS

- Grow positive community connections
- Measure and share metrics about your food rescues
- No requirements of use or program fees
- Organizations offset costs to put into other programming
- Businesses gain peace of mind that organizations are following all food safety practices and donations are tracked
- Access educational resources

Types of Food

- All edible food
- Education around date labelling
- Best before is not a food safety indicator
- Food Donation and Consumption Timetable indicates how long food can be donated and consumed by, in relation to its' best before date
 - CFIA
 - National Zero Waste Council
 - Toronto Public Health

BUSINESSES AND NOT-FOR-PROFITS

Businesses

- Any type of business
- Has business number
- Size of donations variable
- Fresh, prepared and shelf-stable product
- Donation of Food Act, 1994

Not-for-Profits

- Any type of NFP
- Has business or charitable registration number
- In compliance with Ontario
 Regulation 493 Food Service
 Premise Regulation
- Cannot sell food for profit

SAFE FOOD TRANSPORT BAGS

- Provided through MOECP funding
- A way to support safe food transportation
- Available to the first set of organizations who sign up
